



Definitely a talented artist at work here! Nicely bordered. A self-portrait? What is he breaking through? You might have considered completely covering the Mailer's Postmark Permit part of the cancel and just used the circular part maybe to the left of the stamp.

Simple yet effective design. Nice stamp and cancel tie-in.

Bold design reminding knowledgeable collectors of the first 25 cent plastic flag stamp design of 1990, but in wavy mode. You might have considered moving the text slightly to the right further from the top part of the flag, but this may have been done to avoid overprinting by the cancel. Use of blue ink for the cancel would have been more striking than red. Could you have moved the cancel more to the right and not used the non-text striped part of its design?

Very nice cachet design used, but perhaps blown up too much from its original size creating a grainy pixilated effect. Did you try to remove the "September 11, 2001" text within the original design near the lower left of the flag, or did blowing the image up make it less than readable? Great slogan cancel used tying a most appropriate stamp!

Counting all the stars on this design could be a challenge even for those of us with glasses! The red border could have been placed on all four sides rather than the three to give it a more of a uniform appearance. The eagle sticker could have been used as the central point of the sticker cachet, surrounded by a balanced and symmetrical placement of flags, making the overall effect more balanced.

The subtle shading of the background flag is quite nice. However the text in the lower right is difficult to see, reading as follows:


It's "one nation UNDER GOD..." or bite my skinny old ass and leave!
