Hi Joe.



Ted's large, 5"x9½", cover, shown on page 1, was cut down from a much larger mailing piece. Note Ted's detail in his lettering that follows the curves in the flag. Unfortunately the stamps are pen canceled, but a machine postmark is at the bottom left.



Joanne, ACE 505 writes "I think this cover is one of the cutest-prettiest covers **Dave (Snyder, ACE 487)** has ever done."

Cover is made from a folded advertisement on a very shinny coated paper.

This memorial cover by Charlie Delgado, ACE 20 is for a high school classmate that lost his life while serving in Vietnam. This cover is postmarked on the 52nd anniversary of that event.





Annajoy Marks, ACE 559, is doing remarkably well with the "Manga" style of art. She sent John Martin this stunning original art cover of a young lady with butterfly wings, seated on a crescent moon. The art was on a larger piece of paper, folded to make an envelope. I reopened the paper to show the whole image. It is signed "Kit 2021," Kit being a nickname for Annajoy sometimes used by her friends

What Is 'Great ACE Day' or GAD?

Great ACE Day, or GAD as it's often referred, is an event that is celebrated annually on August 1st. In 1987, Kenneth C. Jenkins (ACE #17) had a brainstorm and named it Great ACE Day. The first four "targets" and cover "themes" were selected by Ken.

After Ken left ACE, the ACE officers picked the theme, but the membership nominated and then voted for the GAD target. The theme portion of the process is not always utilized, usually determined by the current president. At some point in time it was decided not to have a theme but to check the annual membership roster for the collecting interests for the one nominated, and to design covers around the



recipient's collecting or other interests. This makes cover designs more personal to the GAD target.

Once the GAD target is determined, the selected recipient would be inundated with covers - all marked GAD (# xx), and postmarked August 1. It's a fun event and all ACE members are encouraged to participate by sending GAD covers to all members of ACE while sending several extras to the GAD target.

From an old ACE handbook, here are some "tips" from Ken Jenkins for consideration during the GAD process:


- Make a friendship stamp (Local Post)
- 2) Design a special cover. Mail extra covers to favorite ACE'ers
- 3) Mail special covers to members you haven't written to in the past
- 4) Mail your covers early on August 1st

This is the premier annual ACE event, and all members are encouraged to participate. This is a once in a lifetime honor bestowed on an ACE member; final recipients can only be selected once!














Daughter of early ACE member seeking help

My name is Cynthia Schmidt and my Dad, Gilbert Schmidt Ace #386, was part of the ORIGINAL Ace group. My Dad passed away in October 2019, at age 93, and I am just now bringing myself to go through some of his collections. I have in front of me, 26 ACE letters, from 1942 to 1944 from other Ace artists from across the USA and Australia.

Gilbert always had a passion for art starting a very young age. He received his Bachelor's degree from the then Milwaukee Teacher's College (now University of Wisconsin – Milwaukee) and a Masters Degree in Art/Art History from the University of Iowa.

Prior to college he served proudly in the United States Navy as a ship fitter. He served our country in WWII from 1943-1944.

After College he got his first teaching job at Random Lake High School (RLHS), in Random Lake, Wisconsin. He taught Art and Art History at RLHS for the next 36 years and then he retired at age 70.

Throughout his entire life he ALWAYS was painting. His preferred medium was oil on canvas and his preferred subject matter was any thing that was Train related (steam engines) and anything related to Navy ships. When my Dad went to Heaven in 2019, as his only daughter and his only heir, I had the very difficult responsibility to go through all his belongings and all of his artwork.

So now you may be thinking, how does ACE fit in? Well, much to my surprise and amazement, I now have 26 ACE envelopes (some with letters inside) from 1942-1943 that my Dad tucked away in a cabinet for safe keeping that I have never seen before. Imagine my delight when I found these ACE envelopes and letters. My Dad was part of the original ACE club and he is/was ACE #386. My goal here is simple – to connect with any/all ACE collectors to see if they have any of my Dad's letters and Ace Envelopes. I have many, many of his original art pieces but these letters are nothing short of fantastic. And......the letters inside each envelope are even more interesting than some of the art covers.

My hope is that someone out there has art envelopes from my Dad because I know he responded to each person that wrote to him. I am willing to trade any of the Art Covers I have in exchange for my Dad's.



The black and white photo was my dad taken some time in 1959-1960 as it was his first photo as Faculty or as a Teacher at Random Lake High School for the Year Book. The other photo, one of my favorites, was taken in 2018, about a year before his death at age 92. I am and always will be a Daddy's girl and not a day goes by that I don't miss him – terribly.














Dianne Becker, ACE 567, featured a guitar with a patriotic strap and patriotic stamps.




Dave Lemon, ACE 141, used a flag motif cover with redtinted Airmail stamps.



ONE OF A KINDERS




I added the caption balloons to make it clear what was bouncing around in the brains of these beasts as they explained their preferences for what they expected from the local barista.
