# Thanks for a great year, and a Great ACE Day! By JOHN MARTIN, ACE 343

There are many great things about the Great ACE Day. It's our Indy 500, our Super Bowl, the World Series, our New Years Day, the FIRST day of school and the LAST day of school. In other words, it's a peak, a high point of our collecting year. What we do the rest of the year, many times it seems, either flows from or leads up to that annual cover-sending extravaganza, the Great ACE Day.

ACE member Ken Jenkins created the Great ACE Day in 1987, giving someone in ACE the opportunity to be the "Target" and giving all the other members the opportunity to flood that Target with covers, as well as exchange special covers with as many other members as possible.

This year, I was nominated, along with three fine ACE members – Jim Eckert, ACE 179; Doc Nichols, ACE 379, and Sabrina Curtis, ACE 420, as a Target candidate.

To actually be the winner, as past Targets will tell you, is a mixture of emotions, including surprise, amazement, wonder, humility, gratitude, appreciation and the utter joy of receiving over 500 covers and seeing the talent, imagination and creativity of our members on display in one short span of time. To all of you, I say:

# Thank you very much!!

It is difficult to find a better word in the English language than just the plain old "Thank You" which, somehow, seems to say it all.

Beyond a heart-felt statement of thanks, however, I want to pay tribute to you and your covers in both a personal and a public way.

Personally, I have been and will continue to be working on sending each of you a written "thank you", commenting on the covers you sent. Publicly, the idea entered my head to try to write a verse of poetry for each of you who sent G.A.D. covers, a verse that would in some way say something about at least one of the covers you sent, or about some other aspect of your ACE participation.

In the beginning, I was only planning to write a verse for each one from whom I had received a G.A.D. cover, but I soon realized there were some who, while I didn't receive a "specific" G.A.D. cover from them, nonetheless are much appreciated fellow members with whom I have exchanged on many happy occasions at other times.

So, I expanded the list of verses, though I couldn't accomplish the feat of making up a verse about EVERY member (but I could always do that another

time, I told myself!). I hope that those I left out are not offended, but I've written so many poems that I'm starting to fast run out of fresh ideas for something to say, let alone something to rhyme!!

And, I admit, some of the verses are pretty darn corny. (Maybe you'll think ALL of them are! If you do, that's okay!!)

Alongside the verses I'm trying to place copies of the cover or covers by that ACEr, although I haven't started to actually do that yet so, if I run out of space to put covers, I hope you'll understand!

Before we get to the poem itself, however, here is a bit of my experience with this year's Great ACE Day.

I received a card saying that Jim Eckert, ACE 179, was the Target, and my granddaughter, Danielle Zandecki, ACE 437, received a similar card (her ACE address is my home address in Centralia). I didn't know if Jim was really the Target or if I was, because the G.A.D. tradition is to fool the Target into thinking it's someone else.

But, I DID for sure that Jim was MY Target! I began putting together various types of covers for Jim – a few FDCs, some special cancels, and some computer cachets, along with some hand-colored and hand-lettered covers, plus some collage covers, which are always fun to do.

Of course, all those covers had to be addressed, and it wasn't too long before I knew Jim's address by heart! Well, as it turned out, I knew the address okay, but I did get a little mixed up once. When going through the stack of covers, double-checking, I noticed that I had addressed one to Jim "Bastrop" instead of Jim "Eckert." I left it the way it was, as I figured Jim would probably get a laugh out of it when he received it down in Bastrop, Texas!

On Saturday, July 31, I went to the Galvin Post Office to mail my covers to Jim. Gerri, the substitute postmaster who works Saturdays, was thumbing through all the covers, enjoying looking at them, when she suddenly said: "Hey, you addressed THIS one to yourself!" I looked at it and saw that I had written "John Martin, ACE 179." I had used my name and Jim's ACE number; the rest of the address for him was correct! I laughed and told her to just send it with the rest! I figured Jim might get a laugh out of that one, too. That's what happens when you write names and addresses so many times: You start to go batty and write crazy things!

I also opened my P.O. Box while I was there and found seven or eight covers, some of which identified me as the G.A.D. Target. Since the newsletter had said to mail covers so that they would arrive on or around Aug. 1, these were the first robins of spring, so to speak! Still, I wasn't fully convinced that I actually was the

Target until Monday, when my medium-sized post office box was filled to overflowing! Eighty covers came in Aug. 2 and 80-100 more each day for the next few days. After that, the daily volume decreased, but the covers kept coming in. In fact, as I write this in mid-August, they're still showing up! Well, I've put it off as long as possible. But now, it's time for my "Thank You" poem to my fellow ACErs!


Jim Eckert had a job to do with


I met Kurt Laubinger at Phil's


Those first days were rough ones and,
