The shocking tale of Halley's comet!

"TROMPE L'OEIL"

In the past months of being in ACE, I've sent out many covers using a style of art called "TROMPE L'OEIL". This is a French word meaning "deceiving to the eye". The object is to portray the subject as if it were coming out of the envelope, forming a ragged hole in the process. Examples of this type of art can be found in the "American Illustrated Cover Catalogue". Businesses in the 1800 and 1900's used this type of art on their stationary, sometimes to show their product or get the attention of the addressee.

"UKIYOE"


Recently several of my covers have shown Oriental women...Japanese to be exact. This style is called "UKIYOE"....meaning "picture of the floating world". It was one of the most important schools of art of the EDO period in Japan. The first works to be done in this style of art showed gorgeously dressed figures, usually women of the lower class, performing commonplace tasks or pleasures. Hishikawa Moronobu is generally accredited as the first master of UKIYOE. This style of art has flourished since the 17th century.




